8. Privatization or quasi-privatization of public assets to enable the efficient management and deployment of resources.
9. The role of Uber, Elon Musk, Waymo, and other private options in reinventing cities.
10. The future of electric, driverless, and non-grounded vehicles.
11. The present and future of efficient trucking and parcel distribution and delivery in cities and in suburbs.
12. Security and safety of our critical infrastructure.
13. Congestion and its impact. Mitigating strategies to reduce it.
